b) <u>Waste bin, Moor Pasture Way</u>: The Clerk reported that West Suffolk Council was not providing litter bins or dog waste bins at present. AGREED that the Parish Council should buy one from another supplier at a maximum cost of £500, plus £50 for installation. Cllr Judge will manage this project.

5. Local authority reports

a) Suffolk County Council

Comments made by County Cllr Bobby Bennett included:

- o In October Milestone would replace Kier as the highways contractor
- The County Council was trying to streamline the way that 'small works' were dealt with
- Fees for road closures for street parties celebrating the Coronation were being waived
- A speed survey was being carried out in the village soon; depending on the speeds recorded it might be possible for a 40 mph buffer zone to be installed at the Thurlow end of the village.

Clly May asked whether there could be a 40 mph limit in Withersfield Road.

Clly Holloway said flooding in Withersfield Road was dangerous and also damaged the road surface. County Cllr Bennett said it was best to report it to the County Council again.

Clly Holloway said that 'skirting' work on the pavement in School Road had not yet been done; County Cllr Bennett said it was likely to be done very soon.

District Cllr Peter Stevens said that the Haverhill northern by-pass had been delayed until early 2024.

4. Matters arising (continued)

- c) <u>Village communications</u>: Cllr Fisk had set up a Facebook page for the Parish Council; the next step was to make it accessible by residents.
- d) Heritage Trail: The Working Group has not yet met
- e) <u>Cost of living crisis</u>: A District Council document had been circulated.
- f) <u>Anaerobic digester</u>: Agreed that the Parish Council would not make any comment until a planning application had been submitted. District Cllr Stevens said he had some concerns about potential traffic volumes and routes.
- g) <u>Elections</u>: (To be discussed under Item 8)
- h) <u>Drains</u>: District Cllr Stevens was thanked for arranging for a road-sweeper to be used in School Road, which had helped a little. He offered to request more frequent road-sweeping there. The Parish Council will monitor the situation in the spring.
- i) <u>Tree-planting</u>: Following the successful completion of the tree-planting opposite the entrance to the Karro food processing plant, Cllr Judge was thanked for managing the project. There was some discussion as to whether the Parish Council should plant more trees.
- j) <u>Dedham Vale & Stour Valley AONB</u>: The Clerk reported that a grant may be available for the Heritage Trail project but, having spoken to the AONB about it, suggested that it would be helpful if the Parish Council first had an idea of what the project might cost and how the money would be spent.
- k) <u>Police & Crime Commissioner's survey on proposal to increase precept</u>: Details had been circulated via e-mail tree
- I) <u>Coronation celebration</u>: (To be discussed under Item 9)
- m) "<u>Levelling-up" event (15th Feb 2023</u>): There were no attendees from the Parish Council.

b) West Suffolk District Council

Comments by District Cllr Peter Stevens included:

- o The District Council's 2023-24 Council Tax increase is the county's lowest.
- Plans for a new recycling centre in Haverhill would be going ahead at some point.
- He had received assurances that the hedges being removed when a pipeline was laid from Great Wratting to Hundon would be re-planted.
- The District Council was still trying to get adequate screening provided at Anglian Water's site near the A143/B1061 junction in Little Wratting.
