AGREED that Great Wratting Parish Council should strongly support the application and should comment as follows: "Huge efforts have been made by the householder to improve the appearance of Wheel Cottage, and whilst it is unfortunate and regrettable that the replacement windows are not strictly in accordance with the original listed building consent, the fact is that they are virtually identical to the untrained eye. They are very pleasing in appearance. Furthermore, if the existing (new) windows are replaced they could not be re-used and we consider that their removal would be highly wasteful and damaging to the environment.
